

TRANSITION FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES, UNDERGRADUATE CERTIFICATE

Effective Fall 2025, the Transition for Student with Disabilities Undergraduate Certificate has suspended admission.

This program provides courses to increase the knowledge and awareness of transition planning for students with disabilities from school to adult life. Students will critically examine the components of state-of-the-art transition practices for students with disabilities including how to collaborate with the adult service system and the business community, support students on the job, conduct culturally responsive transition assessment, and link academic instruction to transition practices.

Admission
