

# INFORMATION ARCHITECTURE: INFORMATION ORGANIZATION, GRADUATE MICROCREDENTIAL

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Information architects help bridge the gap between people and technology by designing intuitive, user-centered digital experiences. This graduate microcredential prepares students to apply foundational concepts from library and information science to the design of websites, taxonomies, and navigation systems. Students also explore interaction design strategies to enhance usability and support user needs.

Designed for those pursuing careers in information architecture, this microcredential emphasizes practical design skills, critical thinking, and an understanding of how people seek and interact with information online. Like all UWM microcredentials, it is designed to clearly demonstrate practical skills and competencies that help professionals stand out in a competitive job market.
